of Spamalot: School Edition, brought to life by students from Simonds Catholic College and our friends from the Academy of Mary Immaculate.



This show is more than just a celebration of Monty Python's humour and silliness. It's a celebration of our school community, and the development of its theatre program over the last five years.

Twenty-eight of our boys, many of whom had never stepped on stage before, have worked alongside six talented young women to create something bold and joyful. (Twenty-eight boys - for a school of Simonds' size, this is a phenomenal effort.) Together, they have given countless hours to this strange and wonderful story about knights, coconuts, and the Holy Grail.

After the darker themes of Frankenstein: The Modern Intelligence last year, our team felt the need for something lighter, and 'brighter'. But don't be fooled – creating Spamalot has been hard work. It asked for courage, discipline and trust. It meant learning lines, singing, dancing (often at the same time?!), and long painful rehearsals of Mr Bentley's attempt to deliver Broadway-level choreography.

For a boys' school, a show like this is particularly powerful. It offers something rare.

In a world that often expects boys to be tough or quiet or competitive, Spamalot flips all of that on its head, kicks it in the shins and has a group of French knights win a battle by doing the can-can. It takes **real courage** to be this silly on purpose.



We are especially proud that our tech and backstage crew is entirely student-run this year. They have taken the lead in lighting, sound, props, set design and special effects. Some students are trying theatre for the first time. Others are returning to lead and mentor, such as my assistant director, Jack Witt, or our experienced stage manager, Noah Longmire. Whether they are on stage or behind the scenes, each student has played a part in something bigger than themselves.

Tonight's design and aesthetic were entirely shaped by student ideas and a shared love of stagecraft and storytelling. Every decision of silliness was an offer made by a student. What you see on stage is proof of what can happen when students are trusted and encouraged to surprise us.



This is why we do it. Because the performing arts help students feel known, supported and inspired. They learn to speak up, to listen, to take risks and to push through. These lessons stay with them for life.

Thank you to Nhi Vuong, Akyra Tran and Donna McCartney for your creative leadership; to Ziggy Kartalis for building our monumental castle (on wheels, mind you!); to Daniel Vuillermin for organising lighting and sound; to Alistair Forge and Chloe Barbopoulos for coordinating front of house; to Liam Perrera for your support at rehearsals; to Rachel Luong for initiating our school matinee program; to Robert Anastasio and Helen Koutoulogenis for their leadership and support; to Vic Tietze for filming and soonto-be-editing the show; to Greg Edwards for designing the digital program; and to every parent, teacher and learning support officer who painted a wall, sewed a costume, moved a prop or lent a hand. Ryan Bentley Director

Ryan has directed, produced and adapted productions of 'Frankenstein: The Modern Intelligence' and 'Treasure Island' with SCC, as well as collaborated with AMI for their production of 'Legally Blonde'. He has also directed productions of 'City of Angels' (Waterdale), 'Company' (ICAC), 'Parade' (UMMTA), 'The Book of Everything' (Geelong Repertory Theatre), 'Godspell' (NTC), 'Green Room' (Melbourne Fringe Festival), 'The Play of Herod' (CoNC), 'The Arthurians' (Alchemy Consort), 'Honk! The Musical' (Theatre Collective), and Rameau's 'Hippolyte et Aricie' (CoNC). He has vocally directed productions of 'Grease' (Clonard College) and 'The Wizard of Oz' (GG) and has conducted the Eileen Martin Singers at Costa Hall for the Geelong Summer Music Camp on two occasions. He has worked as a stage manager, lighting designer, sound designer, and technical director for productions of '9 to 5' (Waterdale), ' A Midsummer Night's Dream' (NTC), 'Chicks Dig It' (Melbourne Fringe Festival), and various productions for Union House Theatre at the University of Melbourne. As well as performing in amateur musical theatre in over twenty productions, he has also worked with Victorian Opera, the Choir of Newman College, Alchemy Consort, Schola Cantorum and the Australian Shakespeare Company as a chorus member and featured soloist.

STROPSIS

giving a brief overview of medieval England.

A Scandinavian village appears, with Finnish villagers singing and dancing to the "Fisch Schlapping Song", led by their enthusiastic Mayor. The Historian returns, irritated, and tells them he said "England", not Finland.

The villagers disperse, replaced by a group of penitent monks in hooded robes chanting and hitting themselves in the face with their bibles. King Arthur travels the land with his servant Patsy ("King Arthur's Song"), trying to recruit Knights of the Round Table to join him in Camelot and his quest for the Holy Grail. He encounters various strange people, including a pair of guards who are more interested in debating whether two swallows could successfully carry a coconut than in guarding their castles. Sir Robin and Sir Lancelot meet as they attempt to dispose of the sickly Not Dead Fred ("He Is Not Dead Yet").

They agree to become Knights of the Round Table together, with the apparently immortal Sir Fred.

Meanwhile, Arthur attempts to convince a peasant named Dennis Galahad that he (Arthur) is king of England because the Lady of the Lake gave him Excalibur, the sword given only to the man fit to rule England. However, Dennis and his mother, Mrs. Galahad, are political radicals and deny that any king who has not been elected by the people has any legitimate right to rule over them. To settle the issue, Arthur has the Lady of the Lake and her Laker Girls appear to turn Dennis into a knight ("Come With Me"). Cheered on by the Knights and Laker Girls ("Lakers Cheer"), the Lady of the Lake turns Dennis into Sir Galahad and together, they sing a generic Broadway love song ("The Song That Goes Like This"). Together, with Sir Bedevere and Sir Not-Appearing-In-This-Show, they make up the Knights of the Round Table ("All for One").

The five knights gather in the illustrious Camelot ("Knights of the Round Table"). During their revelry, they are contacted by God who tells them to locate the Holy Grail. Urged on by the Lad of the Lake, the Lady of the Lake's right-hand man ("Find Your Grail"), the Knights set off. They are viciously taunted by French soldiers at a castle they come to, and attempt to retaliate by sending them a large wooden rabbit in the style of the Trojan Horse; however, they realize after the fact that it was not as simple as leaving the rabbit and walking away - they were supposed to be inside of it. Defeated, they leave in a hurry when the French attack with a plush-toy cow ("Run Away").

follow King Arthur and Patsy into a "dark and very expensive forest" where they are separated. King Arthur meets the Knights who say Ni, who demand a shrubbery. King Arthur despairs of finding one, but Patsy cheers him up ("Always Look on the Bright Side of Life") and they find a shrubbery shortly thereafter.

The Knights accept it, but next demand that King Arthur put on a musical and bring it to Broadway. Oh dear...

The Black Knight appears, but King Arthur more or less defeats him by cutting off both his arms and legs, leaving to find Sir Robin. Sir Robin, after wandering the forest for some time ("Brave Sir Robin"), finds King Arthur and insists that it would be impossible for them to accomplish this next task ("You Won't Succeed on Broadway If You Don't Have Any Crew"). King Arthur and Patsy promptly set off in search of crew members.

While the Lady of the Lake laments her lack of stage time ("The Diva's Lament"), Sir Lancelot receives a letter from what he assumes is a young damsel in distress. He is a little surprised to find that the damsel is an effeminate young man named Herbert ("Where Are You?"/"Here Are You") whose overbearing, music-hating father, the King, is forcing him into an arranged marriage. Lancelot advocates for Herbert after the king returns, but the whole scene is unfortunately interrupted by an overbearing S.W.A.T. team.

King Arthur begins to give up hope of ever putting on the Broadway musical and laments that he is alone, even though Patsy has been with him the entire time ("I'm All Alone"). The Lady of the Lake appears and tells Arthur that he and the Knights have been in a Broadway musical all along. All that's left is for King Arthur to find the Grail and marry someone. After picking up on some not-too-subtle hints, Arthur decides to marry the Lady of the Lake after he finds the Grail.

Reunited with his Knights, Arthur meets Tim the Enchanter who warns them of the danger of an evil rabbit. When the rabbit kills Sir Bors, Arthur calls on Brother Maynard and uses the Holy Hand Grenade of Antioch against the evil rabbit.

A 'clue' showing a combination of letters and numbers is also revealed by the rabbit's puppeteer. Pondering the final clue, Arthur admits that they're "a bit stumped with the clue thing" and asks God to "give them a hand". The grail is conveniently "found"; Arthur marries the Lady of the Lake (who reveals her name is Guinevere); Lancelot and Herbertreunite; and Sir Robin decides to pursue a career in musical theatre ("Act 2 Finale & Bows").


